If you don't believe me, simply think back to the times you have found yourself snapping your fingers or tapping your feet ... to a tune that you don't even like.

Our world relies on rhythm. The rising of the sun marks a brand new day and its setting ushers in the night. The waxing and waning of the moon ensures the regularity of the tides. Winter gives way to Spring as the seasons conspire to transform the creation.
